CCO response to COVID19: The CCO is identifying members with a higher need – over 900 in the region – to assess if they are at high risk for COVID and how to support them, along with behavioral health and Social Determinants of Health. We have developed a list of regional and local resources, which is updated in real time. We are partnering with localities to resource food. Staff are deployed to help update 211 statewide, a 24/7 resource. The CCO is preparing for increased membership, and the large grant applications are available until May 15th. The CWIF opens at the end of June, and emergency funds have been provided to over 20 organizations.

Joell: Provided update on state and local COVID19 statistics, including enrollment numbers and issues, and case counts. We have pulled together a myriad of services in a short time: phones with minutes, tents, hygiene kits, etc. A second wave is predicted in the fall and we are preparing. The Regional Food Bank has a great ability to leverage donations, getting \$3 worth of food out of each dollar. The need is double what it was a month ago. CCA reports a 60-70% increase for assistance with housing, utilities, and food. Showers are now available at Seaside High School on Wednesdays from 12-3pm; includes clean underwear and sock, hygiene kits.

What to do if you are sick: Joell described symptoms and steps for self-care and seeking help and provided a written guide.

New Business/Announcements: The group that our May meetings will be on May 12th and 26th. We will continue to assess what works best for the group going forward.
