- Advisory Council members approved July minutes with the suggestion to attach the Innovator Agent update to the minutes. The agenda was approved, and introductions were made around the table.
- The Advisory Council agreed to change the October meeting date, to accommodate Community Wellness Investment Fund applicants, giving them enough time to prepare for a presentation.
- A representative from the Department of Human Services (which recently acquired the application responsibilities for Medicaid in Oregon), joined the Advisory Council to discuss the ONE system (OregONEligibility) and explain what this system means for the state, community partners, and the members. They explained that the system is online and available to everyone for use. It will give an eligibility determination on the spot, although in many cases further information will be needed before continuing with the application. There were in depth discussion about what this could mean for the local community and redetermination rates in Clatsop County.
- The Advisory Council was updated on the Healthy Hearts Incentive Fund Project Proposal. The project passed after the vote from Advisory Council members.
- The Advisory Council was given the Innovator Agent update. It was discussed that the bottom line regarding the turnover at the state level is that CCO's are well established and are proving to be a successful model. The Council was informed that beginning July 1, CCO's are no longer required to contract with existing Dental Care Organizations (DCO's). Also two new metrics have been added to the OHA Metrics; Childhood Obesity and Emergency Department use by those with a Mental Health diagnosis. Also, it was decided that the challenge pool would be consisted of measures regarding early childhood.
