Summary of Minutes January 2016 Tillamook County Community Advisory Council

The committee approved the agenda and the October 2015 minutes.

Innovator Agent updates:

The Oregon *One* system rolled out in December to staff at OHA. The applicant portal is expected to open on February 15th. The *One* system will allow members the ability to update and manage changes to their address and other relevant information, including an automated determination process. OHA will release their mid-year report that compares the CCO's performance related to the metrics for the first half of 2015 toward the end of January. The full report for 2015 will be available in June, which will be used to determine payout for 2015. Joell also mentioned tobacco prevalence and childhood immunization are two new metrics for the CCO in 2016. This year all members covered by OHP (even children) will receive a 1095-B from the state that shows they had coverage. This is a new reporting obligation and members will need to report it on their federal tax return. OHA will mail forms January 29, 2016.

CPCCO members are now eligible for a free cell phone (one per household) through *SafeLink Wireless*. Nancy provided flyers with additional information on how members request service.

Completed applications need to be submitted by March 1, 2016. All applicants will be notified of the status of their request no later than March 31.

invited to join the Board of Directors at their meeting in Tillamook at 10am. Please save the date, more details to come.

CareMessage is a free self-referral, text-messaging service available to CPCCO members that is designed to help improve their health care needs. The service will send appointment reminders, health and wellness tips, education information, etc. Promotional material being developed and service should be available in the next month or two.
