Learning Theme: Regional Care Team (RTC):

Provides Care Coordination for OHP member, they provide system navigation and connecting to the right services and providers across systems and address other social health needs such as appropriate community and social services, resource, and support. We have a Healthcare Coordinator who is first point of contact. All referrals get triaged to care coordinators and other resources. We have community-based service providers embedded in clinics in each county.
