El Centro NW Abuela, Mama, y Yo This project will increase safe, stable, relationships and environments for children and families and reduce disparities for Latinx children in Clatsop County. Two culture-specific workshops will educate 30 Spanish-speaking parents about generational impacts of various risk factors on health, nutrition, and social determinants of health.	\$19,349 CWIF	Clatsop	Healthy Children and Youth
Tillamook Adventist Community Services Safe Park Expansion This project expands the successful Safe Park in Tillamook County program to accommodate up to five RV/motor homes on a new gravel parking pad with additional chemical toilets and cash for repair parts, batteries, tires, etc. Originally a safe overnight for people living in cars (2023), the ACS lot now provides parking 24/7 with basic, sheltered cooking facilities. EngAGE NW Resilient Community This project will address social determinants of health for youth and families at Broadleaf Arbor, the largest affordable housing community in St Helens. A new drop-in center with programming will serve youth (ages 12-21), providing enrichment and skills classes in addition to a teen substance use disorder support group. Song for Charlie Fentanyl Education This project will educate youth and caregivers about the dangers of counterfeit pills and fentanyl through non-alarmist messaging, overdose response training, and healthy coping strategies. United Way of Columbia County Family Resilience Funding will support distribution of 250 Family Resilience Kits with tools for emotional regulation, healthy routines, and connections to essential resources. LiFEBoat Services Daytime Navigation Funding will extend LiFEBoat’s pilot program of Daytime Navigation Services to more than two days per week.
