Incentive Measure Projects Update

CCO 2.0

Quarterly Focus: Access to Health Care

Explanation of quarterly focus: CPCCO recognizes that access to supports and services has an impact on health and wellbeing of individuals and our communities. To that end, the CPCCO Community Advisory Council seeks to inform, convene and sponsor conversations about community efforts to improve access to all services that support the improvement of health and well-being, as well as address the health impact of social determinants on access.

Mohamed Abdiasis from Oregon Health Authority's Office of Equity and Inclusion spoke via Skype about the five types of Traditional Health Workers and how they improve access to care. Frank Hanna-Williams from Tillamook Family Counseling spoke about mental health crisis services and access to mental health care.
