AGENDA ITEMS:

Meeting opened at 3:00pm by Co-Chair. Agenda and minutes approved. Nancy provided a Community Wellness Investment Funds (CWIF) update. Applicants will be presenting at the September CAC and reviewed at that time. The Regional CAC will review them by the end of September and checks for approved CWIF applications will be issued in October.

Update on CHA/CHIP (Community Health Assessment/Community Health Improvement Plan): We have recently rolled out a pilot of the SenseMaker app, which will be used to collect stories to guide our CCO 2.0 work. In January we will share the results with the community. We will create the new Community Health Improvement Plan in June 2019. CAC members are invited to help with story collection. There will be training provided as well as a stipend.

Membership Update:

One member has resigned, and we ask that CAC members keep an eye out for people who might be interested in serving. We are focused on gaining CAC members who are currently on OHP or have close family members who are.

Incentive Funds Update:

Heather presented on the upcoming OHP and You. After this pilot, we expect to roll it out to other counties.

A guest discussed the suicide prevention event for 9/20. A member discussed this being part of the statewide effort.

The discussion turned to food access, particularly around affordable nutrition. Food Bank Fresh and other programs were mentioned. One of our members is on the City of Tillamook Planning Commission and has offered to bring forward ideas generated by the CAC to the Commission for further support and coordination.

Quarterly Focus: Suicide Awareness and Prevention

Explanation of quarterly focus: CPCCO recognizes that suicide has a significant impact on health and wellbeing of individuals and our communities. We value the collaboration of all our stakeholders, including our members and community partners, to create a healthier Tillamook County. To that end, the CPCCO Community Advisory Council seeks to inform, convene and sponsor conversations about community efforts to prevent suicide, educate the community, and provide supports for individuals and families who have been affected by suicide.
