CRAFT Training for Clinicians and Peers: We sent Eventbrite invites to two sequential 4-hour virtual trainings, August 7 & 14. The CRAFT system helps family members change their interactions with a loved one who's using drugs or drinking too much. The aim: Help that person get into treatment and recovery.
